COVID -19 Update

Governor Ducey signed HB2898. Included in this budget bill is a provision prohibiting counties, cities, towns, schools, and school districts from requiring students or staff to wear a face-covering during school hours and on school property, effective July 1, 2021. Face masks continue to be optional.

Tucson Unified, along with federal, state, and local health officials, continues to recommend face coverings be worn by anyone not vaccinated. In the case of COVID contact or exposure, Hudlow will follow TUSD quarantine guidelines. How does it work?

1. If you test positive, isolate for 5 days and wear a mask. Isolation can end after day 5, **wear a mask** at school and around others. May return to work / school on day 6 if no symptoms.

2. If you have been exposed to someone who tested positive, and you are vaccinated, no quarantine is needed- wear a mask around others for 10 days.
3. If you have been exposed to someone who tested positive, and you are NOT vaccinated, quarantine is needed- stay at home for at least 5 days and wear a mask around others for 10 days. Get tested on day 5.
4. Continue to monitor for possible symptoms.
5. Continue to follow all mitigation recommendations to prevent the spread of the virus wearing face masks, practicing social distancing of 6 feet and proper hand washing.
6. If your child has been feeling ill or with COVID like symptoms, please reach out to Marty Chavez at 731-4817 for TUSD COVID protocols and quarantine guidelines.

Tucson Unified will follow the CDC guidance on Community COVID Level to determine the masking and weekly COVID testing requirements. In order to keep our community safe, we suggest you stay home and test yourself if you are not feeling well. TUSD has a limited amount of tests available; however, you can **order Free In-Home COVID Tests** from the federal government through the USPS website [COVID.gov/tests - Free at-home COVID-19 tests](https://www.usps.com/covid-19)

Hudlow also offers a full time Counselor, Curriculum Service Provider, Multi-Tier System of Support (MTSS) Facilitator, Social Worker, and Reading and Math interventionists. With these systems in place, we offer multiple opportunities for social, emotional, and academic success. Please reach out as soon as possible (and as often as needed) for support. Together we can be an extremely powerful resource for your child and family.

Meals All Hudlow students receive free breakfast and lunch every day. Daily attendance is vital to your student's successful education! Breakfast will be served from 7:30 – 7:45. If your child will be eating breakfast, please make sure they enter through the South Gate. Students will be guided to the cafeteria by an adult for supervision. Monitors and supervision on outdoor playground will start at 7:30 a.m. **Please do not drop off your student before that time.** Gates will be closed at 8:00 am. If your child is late, please call the office. Please review our drop off and pick up system (below) with your child and help to continue keeping all our staff and students safe.

Message from Food Services

Hudlow being a Community Eligibility Program (CEP) site. TUSD Food services staff takes pride and joy in ensuring that all children receive a Free nutritious and tasty breakfast and lunch at school. **DO NOT complete** free/reduced meal applications since the school qualifies for free meals to all enrolled students.

Drop-off / Pick-up: All students will continue to be dropped off and picked up from the south parking lot. This will continue to be a valet system with supervised care. The North parking lot is designated for TUSD staff and volunteers. This system will allow you one-on-one sessions and the safety of social distance.



Student Code of Conduct: We have a limited number in the office. Student Code of Conduct is easily accessed online. Students and parents are encouraged to read this together in order to gain a thorough understanding of the campus expectations and to help ensure a safe, positive learning environment for all students at Hudlow. Our campus has been designated a SAFE-T-ZONE. Any and all incidents will be responded to and - when required - students will be referred to an administrator for appropriate discipline as outlined in the Student Code of Conduct. Students, parents, and community members are encouraged to report drug usage or possession, fights, gang activity, assaults, truancy, violence, weapons, graffiti, vandalism, trespassing, and threats. TUVA Update:

- When a parent chooses “remote” on ParentVue, they are choosing Tucson Unified Virtual Academy. There are *no* hybrid options. This has been communicated to parents by TUSD through links and the TUSD TUVA website page.
- ***TUVA is an instructional model, not a school!*** Therefore, TUVA students will be concurrently enrolled in their “Brick & Mortar” school yet receive their educational experience in this “stand alone” instructional model. Students enrolled in TUVA will continue to receive home school correspondence (i.e. Parentlinks, quarterly bulletins, invites to school events)
- Student schedules: All TUVA students *count* as “brick & mortar” consensus numbers in any given classroom and for overall school enrollment as well as school grade. Thus, TUVA students should receive all their books and materials from the school. We will contact you when it is time to come pick up your materials and participate in state testing.
- TUVA will have limited programs and electives. This has been communicated to parents, via the website.
- Communication to TUVA students/parents regarding the opening of school, distribution of laptops, class schedule, etc. will be directly communicated to TUVA parents/students from Mr. Sanchez.
