Staff members will encourage parent participation to support student learning. <p style="text-align: center;">ANNUAL EVALUATION</p> 	<p>The Hudlow Site Council will annually verify the progress made toward achieving the goals and expected results of the school's Parent Involvement Policy and the effectiveness of the school compact.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;">FLEXIBLE MEETING TIMES AND LOCATIONS</p> 	<p>School personnel will provide a variety of meeting times and locations for the mentioned activities, as requested, to serve our families.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;">BUILDING OF ACADEMIC FAMILY INVOLVEMENT</p> 	<p>Hudlow will provide parents opportunities to attend informational activities (academic workshops, and special projects). Appropriate language support is provided.</p> <p>What is parent involvement? To Hudlow, parent involvement means talking to your child about their day, what they are learning, what they find difficult, and things they think may help them be successful. Most parents think that parent involvement means volunteering time at the school in classrooms. Although we greatly appreciate and value the time at school, the time you spend at home provides a greater impact. This can be done by checking backpacks, reading daily with your child, asking questions about what they are reading (who are the characters, where does the story take place, what happens at the beginning, middle, and end, summarizing what they have read, and reading the newsletters and/or websites to keep you up-to-date about the concepts teachers are working on in the classroom.</p>

PARENTING



Hudlow will provide information about TUSD's programs to assist families with various parental needs. Examples of this may include parenting and child raising skills, general education courses, English as a second language, Parent University, and understanding adolescent development. This will assist parents in setting home conditions that support children as students at each age and grade level. (These classes may not be at Hudlow Elementary.)

COMMUNICATION



Hudlow will provide opportunities beyond parent-teacher conferences, to share information and encourage participation in their child's education. Parents will be provided assistance in understanding goals, assessments, monitoring and decision making to coordinate and participate in their child's educational success.

VOLUNTEER



Volunteering at Hudlow is welcomed and encouraged to create a partnership between families and the school. A fingerprint clearance card may be required.

LEARNING AT HOME



Parents and students will be informed about grade level expectations and standards for performance, policies regarding homework, discipline, attendance, and other issues of importance. Hudlow staff will provide tips and support for encouraging a positive learning environment at home.

DECISION MAKING



Parents are offered meetings and services that will permit meaningful parent involvement in the decision-making process involving the school improvement plan and other programs that relate to the education of their child. Parents will be included as participants in school decisions and will be invited to all Site Council meetings and PTC meetings.

COLLABORTING WITH THE COMMUNITY



Hudlow, in partnership with parents, will seek community resources to connect families to services and strengthen school programs.
