Happy Fiesta de los Vaqueros, I hope you and your family had a safe and healthy weekend.

As you all know, Dr. Trujillo made the decision of returning In Person learning for our students. Our Hawks will start in person on March 24th.

In order for Hudlow to successfully prepare for this reopening, we need to know who will be learning In Person Model or Remotely Model by March 5th.

Please log onto ParentVue to make your choice and acknowledge the COVID-19 procedures and expectation. If you choose Remote, you will likely have a teacher change. Your decision will stay firm until the end of the semester. Please be aware that social distancing in classrooms has changed to 3 feet of distance.

We understand that making this decision can be difficult, but please be aware that if you do not select by the deadline, your student will be automatically set for In Person. You will still need to sign the acknowledgment and disclosure form before your son / daughter enters the building.

Students will be testing when we come back from Spring break. Students that are remote will need to physically come into the school to test for AZMerit. Please keep your eyes and ears open for scheduling on Sing Up Genius. We will need you to sign up your son/daughter for at least 3 tests.

Hudlow Community Schools is the program that runs our after care for our school-aged children here on campus.

As with everything, the ongoing pandemic has changed the way we look at after care. If you are interested in tuition-based aftercare, please fill out the online survey in the link below before March 2nd. With limited resources, we want to make sure your needs will be met here at Hudlow, so please fill this out so we can plan accordingly.

TUSD Grab & Go Free Meals- 4th Quarter

- Meals remain **free to all students** (*USDA has extended the Summer Food Service Program (SSP) which allows us to provide free meals to all children 18 and under through school year 20-21*).
- We will continue to provide breakfast, morning snack, lunch and super snack daily including weekend meals sent home on Fridays.
- Since we are operating SFSP we do not have to utilize the register or student IDs to enter meal transactions. Meals just have to be marked off on a meal count check off sheet.
- The USDA waiver that allows non-congregate feeding has been extended through school year 20-21 so meals do not have to be consumed at school, they can be taken home.
- Breakfast, morning snack, lunch and super snack will all be served grab & go style in bags.
- Grab & Go Meal Bus Routes last day will be Thursday, March 11.
- Weekly meal pick up will be available to families with students that remain remote, starting March 24, every Wednesday at our central facility from 3-5pm ([registration details to come](#)).

K-5:

- ✦ Breakfast bags will be served and taken back to the classroom or other designated eating area.
- ✦ Breakfast bags will include morning snack OR if you prefer morning snack can be picked up separate from breakfast.
- ✦ Lunch bags will be served and lunch eaten in the cafeteria or other designated eating areas.

Super snack (daily) and weekend meals (Fridays) will be provided to distribute to students prior to dismissal. (*weekend meals are cold/frozen to be heated at home*)

Reminder: Seating in the cafeteria or other designated eating areas need to be set up distanced as much as possible (using the "green dot" to show seating) and properly cleaned and disinfected between groups of students.
